

The Royal Academy of Spanish Language defines **friendship** as *personal affection, pure and unselfish, shared with another person, that springs up and strengthens through the contact.*

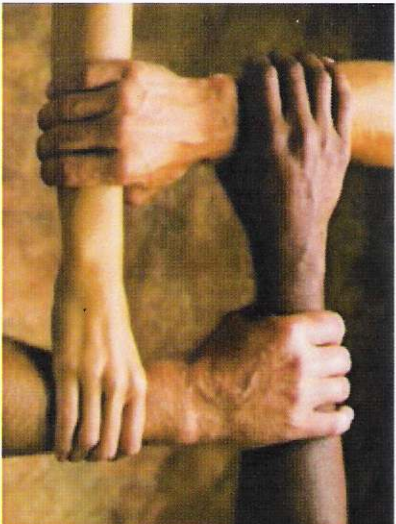
Humans are social animals and, because of that, we need mix with others for growing up as people. It bases on the necessity of membership to a group.
