

“PUNKS”



“Punks not dead” is the most famous slogan of this culture.

This movement appeared in Great Britain in the mid seventies, when the Rock begun a commercial movement and lost their meaning.

Respect ^{to} the name (Punk), in the street there are two opinions; on the one hand, the English press used this name in ^a derogatory form, because the movement was against ^a society and their rules, and on the other hand, two journalists (Legs McNeil and John Holmstrom) created a magazine named “PUNK” to speak about ideas and music of this movement.
